

Roy Peacock's Prophecy, 26 November 2000

Behold, I have declared that there would be a handful of corn in the earth on the top of the mountain – and I have planted that grain on this mountain, saith the Lord. And I have declared that there would be dew on the top of the mountain – and I have placed the dew on this mountain.
